The Event Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Entries will be acknowledged by e-mail if a legible e-mail address is provided. No other acknowledgements will be sent.

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless the entry form is completed in full and accompanied by a signed waiver and entry fees. If using THE ENTRY LINE, you will need to bring the waiver with you to the event. Telephone entries cannot be accepted by the show secretary.
- Cheques dated after the close of entries will not be accepted. Tendering of an NSF cheque will be considered non-payment of entry fees and can result in the cancellation of awards. All NSF/returned cheques will be assessed a \$30 service charge. There will be no refund of overpayments or duplicate entries.
- 3. An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. Written or electronic notification must be received by the Event Secretary by the official closing date and time. If written notification is not received by that time, the dog will remain entered in the event. Entries that are cancelled before the closing date will be refunded.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- 1. The Trial Superintendent will be in full charge of the trial, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. If, because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or complete the trials, no refund of Entry Fees will be made.

THERE WILL BE A LIMIT OF 40 ENTRIES PER EVENT.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB INFORMATION

NOT A CKC MEMBER?

In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.

A Non-Member Participation Fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$62.40, plus applicable taxes. The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members (or dogs co-owned by CKC members).

The Non-Member Participation Fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.

HAVE A MIXED BREED OR A BREED NOT RECOGNIZED BY THE CKC?

These events are open to mixed and unrecognized breeds. In order to compete, mixed and unrecognized breed dogs **must have** a **CANINE COMPANION NUMBER (CCN)** from the Canadian Kennel Club. Mixed-breed dogs must be spayed or neutered. Unrecognized-breed dogs do not need to be spayed or neutered. A dog eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER (FOR A FOREIGN-OWNED, REGISTERED DOG)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). This ERN does not register a dog for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign-owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own number.

AN ERN MUST BE APPLIED FOR WITHIN 30 DAYS OF FIRST DAY OF ENTERING A CKC EVENT TO AVOID THE CANCELLATION OF AWARDS.

PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER (Required for an unregistrable purebred dog)

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregistrable dog of a CKC recognized list of breeds to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. A PEN dog must meet the following criteria: be of a CKC recognized or listed breed; for one reason or another, must not be eligible for CKC registration; and must be spayed or neutered.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING/MASKS: The Provincial physical distancing guideline of maintaining a minimum of 6 feet or 3 metres distance must be adhered to at these events by volunteers and participants. We are asking that you stay in or near your vehicle except when running or exercising a dog. In situations such as dog inspections, handlers meetings, participants may find it necessary to be in closer proximity. In these cases, the wearing of a mask will be required. Participants must provide their own mask or other suitable face covering.


Failure to respect physical distancing guidelines as noted above will result in excusal from the event and event precincts without refund of entry fees.

The field committee reserves the right to alter the course plan as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the event. (The direction will be reversed for the afternoon test.)

ELIGIBLE BREEDS: Chase Ability Program participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the CKC; or have an Event Registration Number (ERN); or have a Performance Event Number (PEN); or eligible for registration with the CKC; or have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed; or have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if it's a mixed breed.

Dogs with breed disqualifications are eligible to enter. Females in season may not enter. A dog may enter only once per event. Running order determined by order in which entries are received. Dogs run as singles.

300-YARD COURSE: This distance is for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers or brachycephalic ("flat-faced") dogs. **Dogs will run one loop.**

600-YARD COURSE: This distance is used for all dogs that do not run the 300 yard course. Dogs will run both loops.

If there is a question as to which course a dog will run, the judge will decide.

RIBBONS: Gold qualifying ribbons will be awarded to dogs passing their test.

RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT




By signing this document you will waive certain legal rights, including the right to sue or claim compensation following an accident. Please read this document carefully.

In consideration of acceptance of the entry and the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win ribbons or prizes at the Chase Ability events to be held on **September 26, 2020**, I agree:

- 1. To hold the Saluki club of Canada including its members, directors, officers and employees (collectively defined as the "SCOC"), as well as the owner and lessor of the real property on which the event is held, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of myself or my dog(s) while in or about the event premises or grounds near the entrance thereto and I assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim;
- 2. COVID-19 RISK: By entering/attending these events, you are acknowledging that a risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. By attending these events hosted by The Saluki Club of Canada, you and any guests voluntarily assume any and all risks related to COVID-19 and agree not to hold The Saluki Club of Canada, or any of their affiliates, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, volunteers or property owner liable for any illness or injury.
- 3. To hold the SCOC harmless from any claim for loss of this dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise and from any claim for damage or injury, even if such loss or damage/injury was caused or alleged to be caused by negligence of the SCOC or any other person(s);
- 4. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Port-a-potty on site.
- Dogs will be run once.
- Lame dogs or bitches in season will be excused and their entry refunded, provided notice is given prior to or during roll call.
- Dogs not present at roll call shall be scratched with no refunds. No Exceptions.
- Dogs are expected to be aroused and excited in the presence of the lure, but handlers must be able to control their dogs for everyone's safety or they shall be refunded their entry and not allowed to run. Additionally, the field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs from the event site.
- Muzzles and catch collars may be used at the handler's discretion. No Flexi-leads, or prong or electronic collars allowed.
- A \$10 fine will be assessed for loose dogs on the field after roll call and until after the last test.
- Bring your own water and shade.
- Please clean up after yourselves and your dogs. Do not stuff plastic bags down holes. Please use the trash receptacles provided.
